

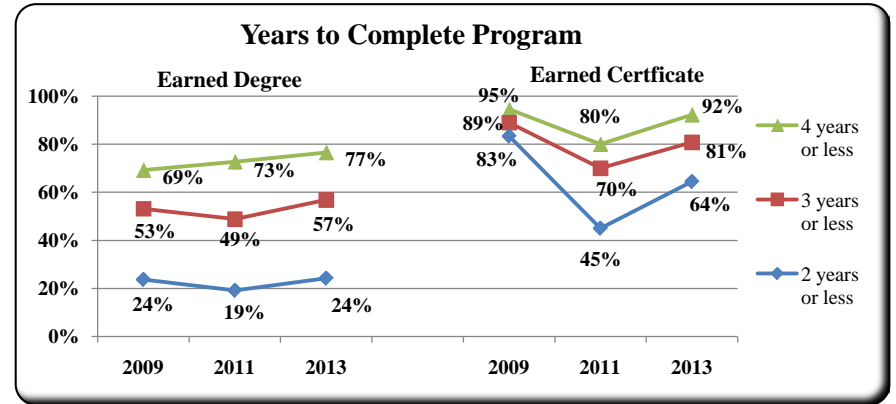
Chabot College Degree and Certificate Graduates

Completion Time and Attendance Patterns 2009 to 2013, by Degree or Certificate Award

Summary

These tables show attendance patterns separately for degree and certificate graduates. A higher percentage of graduates earning a certificate completed their program in 4 years or less compared to graduates earning a degree. In 2013, 92 percent of graduates earning a certificate completed their program in 4 years or less versus 77 percent of graduates earning a degree. The percentage of graduates earning a certificate with no paid work decreased from 55 percent in 2009 to 9 percent in 2013. Over half of degree graduates completed their degree in 3 years or less, while about one quarter completed in 2 years.

The Graduate Survey is given every other year to degree and certificate graduates who attend the Spring graduation ceremony. About one third of the graduates attend, and two thirds of those attending fill out a survey. So the survey results are more representative of those attending graduation than of all graduates. However, it does give us a glimpse to the amount of years it took graduates to complete their
